



The Donchin and Holmes Emerging Scholar Prize

Established on the occasion of FAB's 20th Anniversary, this prize honors the co-founders of FAB, Anne Donchin and Helen (Becky) Bequaert Holmes. The prize is awarded for the best paper accepted for presentation at the biennial FAB World Congress by a graduate student or early career scholar. Award: \$500 USD, a certificate, recognition on the program.

The Call for Applications will be included in the Call for Papers approximately 8-10 months prior to each World Congress.

Criteria for Applying:

1. You submit an abstract (based on your paper) for presentation at the upcoming FAB World Congress,
2. You are currently enrolled in a graduate program (masters, doctorate, or equivalent) or recently graduated (within 2 years),
3. You are currently a member of FAB, and
4. If the paper is not single-authored, all co-authors must meet (1) above (i.e. no faculty co-authors).

Submission Requirements:

- Papers should be between 3,000-6,000 words and prepared for anonymous review
- Papers should be accompanied by an email listing the paper title and the applicant's name, affiliation, and email address, and the applicant's current graduate program and dates of enrollment or the graduate program and date of graduation.

Judging Criteria:

- Knowledge of the relevant literature, Organization/structure, Quality of reasoning, Originality of thought, and Quality of writing.

Fine Print:

FAB reserves the right not to award the prize in any given year. Failure to attend the FAB World Congress typically forfeits the prize, though there may be exceptional circumstances in which this rule is waived. Winners will be encouraged to extend their paper to full length and submit it to IJFAB for review.
